Particularly concerned with the symbiotic possibilities of different modes of expression, he developed cross-disciplinary works of Visual and Sound Poetry, Object-Poems, Artist Books, Book-Objects, Performances, "Anti-art" works etc. From the seventies, extensive trips abroad & a few long stays in Paris, London and New York gave him the opportunity to connect with many other artists including Dick Higgins, Alison Knowles and Richard Kostelanetz from the Fluxus group, thus expanding his research in new theoretical directions.

Lucia Cuba

Lucia Cuba's work approaches fashion, textiles, design and the exploration of wearable forms as performative and political devices, broadening the understanding of the role of design objects from purely functional, commercial or aesthetic considerations, to social, ethical and political perspectives. This constancy, be it in religion, science, history or in organic matter, is visible in her practice through her attempts to make sense of and recognize traces of life. Traditional processes, materials and rituals are often reworked to explore how ideas and beliefs can live, die and be reborn across times and cultures.

Fermín Jiménez Landa

Making performances, public interventions or installations, Jiménez Landa works in equivalence, inversion and interchange processes that makes us see reality from an equidistant point between absurd and prudent, moving and iconoclastic, empirical and unverifiable. His work has been shown in MANIFESTA 11, Künstlerhaus Bethanien, CA2M, MAZ, Artium, 1646, La Casa Encendida, MUSAC, Travesía Cuatro or Nogueras Blanchard.

Sara Rodrigues

Sara Rodrigues is an interdisciplinary artist with a research-led practice working in audiovisual composition and performance. Engaging with the various senses, her work is often participatory and open ended. By exploring the interconnectedness of humans with their ecosystems, both micro and macro, she is interested in future forms of autonomy, resilience and regeneration.

Rodrigo B. Camacho

Rodrigo B. Camacho was born on an island in the northwest African plate. Formally trained as a classical pianist and composer, he makes music, amongst other things. He is interested in language and communication, and in the relationships between structuralism and randomness, emergence and complexity.

Mariana Sarraute

Mariana Sarraute conceives her pictorial work as a kind of stairs that lead the viewer into the emptiness inside the painting. After a long journey of nomadism, she is currently producing in Mallorca, where she has begun a process of blurring and de-construction of her references (alchemical allegories and sheets, Tarot cards, apocalyptic Romanesque murals). Giving way to the alchemy of color and space, Sarraute expresses herself in these pieces as a programmer who paints, and as painter who programs.

Víctor Payares

Payares 'work explores ways of simulating recollection and visual discourse through the dissemination of painting and sculpture. His work is often bright colored, picturing a surreal world built up by parts from a story that has been broken into different pieces. As if to portray a memory or a dream, he uses layers of different material, found objects. Architecture, observation, mapping and cartography are reappearing references throughout his work.

Sophie Mackfall

Sophie Mackfall studied BA Painting and Printmaking at Glasgow School of Art, and MA Painting at the Royal College of Art, London. From 2018-19 she was the Bloomberg New Contemporaries studio bursary holder at One Thoresby Street, Nottingham. Previous exhibitions include 'Y Shaped Strokes', One Thoresby Street, Nottingham, 'WHAT YOU DO, I LIKE', Hospitalfield, Arbroath, 'The London Open', Whitechapel Gallery, London.
